A letter from the founders of the Ben Curtis Family Foundation

One child and one school at a time.

That simple phrase is what helps us focus on the importance of our mission to reduce and even eradicate food insecurity in the communities we serve.

Food insecurity is when there consistently isn't enough to eat in a household. This impacts children. They become preoccupied. Will they have a meal tonight? Will there be snacks this weekend? This harms their ability to focus. Inconsistent meals make children vulnerable to illness, absenteeism and creates hurdles they may never overcome.

When you don't know when or where your next meal is coming from, it is hard to perform tasks in school and to reach your full potential.

Our Birdie Bags – filled with nonperishable snacks, meals and hygiene products – are distributed free to children in area school districts who ask us to help.

Students tell us that they share their bags with siblings. Parents tell us that it helps their own grocery budgets go a little further.

Social circumstances and the pandemic have made it tough on a lot of families. Whatever the circumstances, it is not in the children's control.

This small gesture can mean something very big to these children.

Teachers tell us that the children feel *loved*...that someone outside of the school cares for them.

That's the best reward.

In order to make more children feel loved, the Foundation makes every effort to maximize our impact by increasing our efficiency and making our effort go *further*.

In this year's annual report, we are pleased to share the details on how we make all of our resources go *further* in helping area children and school districts.

The Birdie Bag sends a message to every child: Don't worry. Someone cares. Focus on your responsibilities and become the best version of yourself in school and beyond.

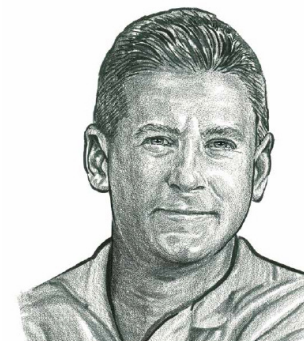
That's the bigger mission of The Ben Curtis Family Foundation – providing food and supplies as **the first step to empower students to succeed.**

The Foundation is co-founded by Ben Curtis. Many people know his golf success story. But not everyone knows just how much Ben overcame the odds in 2003 by rising from obscurity (ranked 396th) to become the first professional golfer since 1913 to win a major championship in his first appearance.

Golf is Ben's passion. The Foundation wants every child to find and develop their own gifts, follow their passion, and the support they need to become their own best champion – to compete in the game of life.

If that means a Birdie Bag filled with food, soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste, and other simple everyday items frees them from some of their worries, makes them laugh, feel confident and work hard – then we will continue providing Birdie Bags to help them succeed, whatever the odds.



Golf is Ben's passion so we are proud that Ben Curtis was inducted in the Greater Cleveland Sports Hall of Fame in 2021. It is our goal to provide children with the support they need so they can focus on their passion so that they, too, can excel.

The Foundation responds to current needs so that children – learning in school or at home – will continue to receive the relief they and their families deserve.

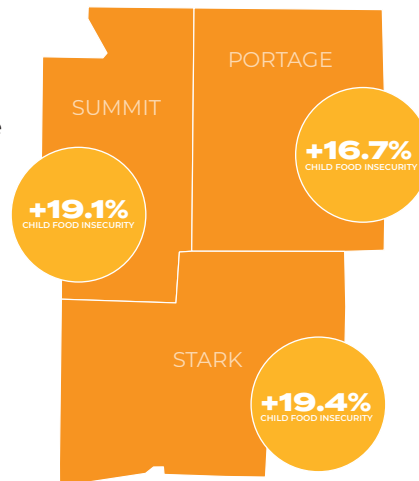
Over the past year, the Foundation has made the effort to maximize our resources so that it does more good for more children.

Growing More Efficient

Our warehouse stores nonperishable products for our Birdie Bags. Since we began using this space, we have grown from serving two to 10 school districts. We didn't know how to best use our space to accommodate this growth. (See story on page 14.) A local company, Kent Elastomer Products, spent a week at our warehouse to teach us how to adopt Lean processes that they follow in their manufacturing and warehouse facilities. The result? We're now better utilizing warehouse space – allowing us to grow and expand in our current facility. We're also saving resources that will directly improve the lives of children we serve.

Growing Our Reach

Food insecurity is a social problem that exists everywhere. We want to provide relief for children and families everywhere. But our approach to addressing is *one child and one school at a time*—starting in our own nearby communities. What began with one school in 2015 has now expanded to 10 school districts. We welcome our newest school district partners in Cuyahoga Falls, Woodridge and Southeast School Districts (see page 10).

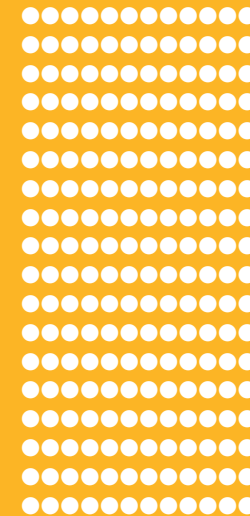


Birdie Bag Distribution

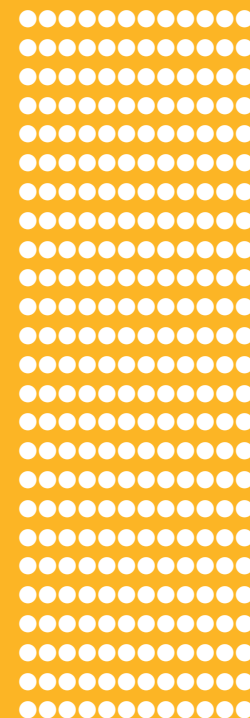

Growing By the Numbers

With this growth in our service to new communities, our distribution numbers have also grown. In 2021, we increased Birdie Bag assembly and delivery to 49,709 Birdie Bags and 150,000+ lb. of food. This means our Birdie Bag distribution has increased by 23%.

So many more area children can be assured that there is more food in their homes. We cannot emphasize enough the importance of nutrition in a child's development. We hope through all of our efforts, we are making a lasting impact on each and every child we support.

Districts We Serve

This past year the Foundation added three new schools to our list of districts we serve – Cuyahoga Falls, Southeast and Woodridge.

This brings our total to 10. But we never rest. Our goal is simple. Reach out and serve school districts with children in homes experiencing food insecurity. We want to address this problem everywhere – but for now we explore our own backyards to help school districts and communities in northeast Ohio.

This expanding map is good news. It means more children are receiving the help they need to overcome barriers so that they can become champions of their own destiny.

5 REASONS WHY Donors Support the Ben Curtis Family Foundation.

1 FOOD INSECURITY Affects Children

Ohio has the 6th highest rate of food insecurity in the country. One in five northeast Ohio children live in food insecure homes. There is more sickness, longer recovery and affects children's ability to focus and perform.

Our goal – reduce and eliminate food insecurity.

2 We Help Children in OUR OWN BACKYARD

Your support through funding, volunteering, and donating to our food and supply drives helps local children and their families in school districts in Summit, Portage, and Stark counties.

Your support in time and resources directly helps our neighbors.

3 SUPPORT GOES FURTHER with the Foundation

Recently big improvements resulted from our partnership with Kent Elastomer Products. This big-hearted local manufacturer shared their Lean expertise to help us streamline processes, reduce costs and maximize benefits to children. Also Andrews Moving, Metis Construction and White House Chicken donate transportation to distribute Birdie Bags. These partnerships help us help more children! **The Foundation is a responsible steward that operates prudently.**

4 HELPS TEACHERS Do Their Job

It frustrates teachers when they can't inspire children who are hungry and distracted or frequently absent and sick. We work directly with students in school districts who need us the most.

Your support helps teachers connect with children who are more ready to learn.

5 Empowers Children To ACHIEVE

The Foundation believes that providing children with access to non-perishable food and toiletries can help level the playing field so they can become the best they can be. There is nothing more basic than food to eat, soap to be clean and toothbrushes for dental hygiene. **We help students focus on accomplishment – not worrying about their next meal.**



Together – We Go **FURTHER**

One way of being grateful for everyone's support is to be responsible stewards of our mission.

This means operating in such a way that our funding, resources and the time of everyone involved **go further to help more children.**

GOING FURTHER with Help from Kent Elastomer Products

In just six years, the Foundation has grown from serving two to ten school districts. But we still operated in the same warehouse space.

This caught the attention of Bob Oborn, president of Kent Elastomer Products (KEP), makers of tubing. KEP operates under Lean manufacturing practices, a five-step process that makes companies more efficient and productive.

KEP's Lean experts volunteered time over a period of two weeks to help us reexamine and improve our methods.

- + **SIMPLIFY** our inventory system
- + **REORGANIZE** our shelving which increased our usable space without moving
- + **IMPROVE** Birdie Bag assembly processes

This saves time, money and supplies. For example, we now save approximately \$400 per month just on ziplock bags. This redirects more resources to help the children and schools we serve. Our improved operational efficiency makes better use of volunteer time and energy.

FURTHERING Public Awareness

In addition to distributing Birdie Bags, the Foundation creates awareness of food insecurity.

Food insecurity is often misunderstood. It is defined as being without reliable access to sufficient and affordable food. For school age children, this means that very often, they are not certain whether there will be food or snacks that day. This can cause anxiety and behavioral issues that greatly impact children's health.

Here's how the Foundation educates the public whenever and wherever we can.

- Before they get to work assembling Birdie Bags and other tasks, all of our new volunteers are given a talk about the impact of food insecurity on our children, families and schools.
- We share with our volunteers how food insecurity affects families – and the direct positive impact their volunteer efforts have on area children, families and schools.
- As a legendary professional golfer, Ben Curtis makes many public appearances. Each of those events includes a presentation about food insecurity.
- The Foundation is frequently invited to share our stories at events. In one case, we celebrated our partnership with Kent Elastomer Products (see above) at Kent State University Honors College.

All of our volunteers, donors, partners and supporters become our best ambassadors!

Foundation FURTHERS Our Reach to 3 Additional Schools

In 2013, the Foundation first began distributing 135 Birdie Bags in one school district. By early 2021, we distributed 5,500 bags a month to 10 school districts (see page 10).

It always comes down to this – one day, one student and one school at a time.

FURTHERING Our Savings

The more help we receive from partner organizations, the more our funding can go to maintaining operations with efficiency – and serving more children.

We have been fortunate to receive much of our food over the past year as the result of grants from the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank.



Other supplies that go into Birdie Bags are purchased only after finding the best wholesale, bulk buying deals we can get.

Because we have seen a rise in the number of children needing a Birdie Bag since the 2021-2022 school started, The Foundation is always looking to partner with additional suppliers so that we can meet the demands for the amounts of food we are needing.

Families Are Stretched FURTHER

Stress – and costs – are on the rise. As the pandemic has fluctuated with intensity, we all seem stretched further. Teachers, students, school systems, families and entire communities have needed relief.

Did you know that Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, widely known as food stamps, do not cover the cost for essential household items, like cleaning products, bathroom tissue or personal hygiene necessities?

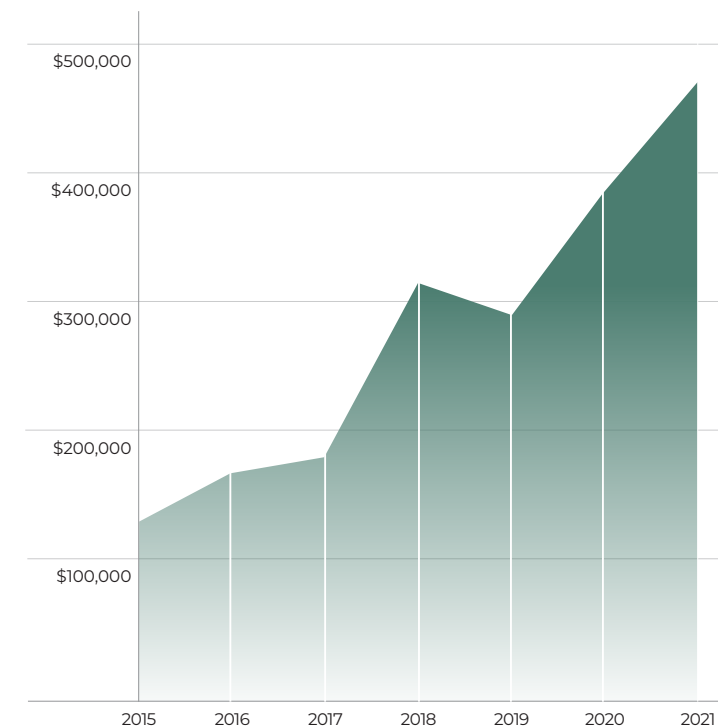
Birdie Bags include easy-to-prepare meals, snacks and a toiletry kit. For many families this provides some relief from grocery costs.

The program has grown significantly as the pandemic took a toll on many local families. For families attempting to raise kids on limited incomes – who may not even qualify for SNAP trying to make ends meet – the Foundation is here to help them **stretch their limited resources further.**

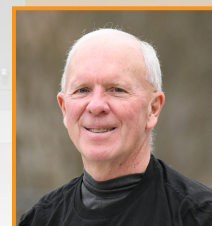

On August 6, 2021, the Foundation hosted our Golf Classic at the Country Club of Hudson, also home of the Ben Curtis Golf Academy. 33 teams/132 players joined us to raise **\$141,772.05** and become CHAMPIONS in our fight against food insecurity.

Our annual wine event, **The Tour International**, was held at the Country Club of Hudson on October 2, 2021, with hors d'oeuvres along with 50 wines to sample and purchase from around the globe. Master sommelier Larry O'Brien was on hand to pour a few of his favorite selections at this outdoor patio event that includes toasty fire pits and, of course, a little action on the putting green.



A Very Merry Dinner

Giving Trees to benefit children participating in our Christmas program A Very Merry Dinner, were placed in businesses and stores around the community. This not only helps local food insecure children – it also supports local businesses and organizations.

Local businesses hosted Giving Trees with gift wishlists for children participating in AVMD. This year there were 529 kids and 184 families for the drive-through event in 4 different districts. Our volunteers wrapped an estimated 5,500 gifts and school faculty helped us carry out the event the day of. We expanded to four schools last year adding Southeast and Windham.
