# Behind The *Birdie Bag*

Long before the first Birdie Bags made their way into the hands of students, our story begins on the fairways. A young rookie named Ben Curtis shocked the world by winning the 2003 Open Championship in his very first appearance at a major tournament. That victory would later launch a remarkable career on the PGA Tour and give Ben a lifelong connection to the word “birdie”—a golf term that now carries new meaning in our foundation.

## **Beginnings**

The Ben Curtis Family Foundation was established in 2013, and since then, Ben and Candace Curtis have always strived to spread their goal of fighting childhood hunger in a way that has been both memorable and inspiring. Their efforts have impacted thousands of children and given kids the opportunity to succeed by meeting their essential need for food.

## **Food Insecurity**

The USDA defines food insecurity as a lack of consistent access to enough food to live an active, healthy life. Due to rising costs of staple pantry items, such as milk, eggs, and meat, food insecurity has become a prominent issue, causing many families to struggle to provide essentials for their families. BCFF created the Birdie Bag as a way to fight food insecurity. Each bag contains 6 meals and 4 snacks, which will be packed and distributed to the various school districts we are partnered with.

## **Partners**

This past year, we've seen just how much connection fuels purpose. Community sponsors and partners are a vital part of our mission; they are the reason we have been able to reach even more children. Each bag represents more than a meal—it represents hope, stability, and the opportunity for every child to become a champion in their own life. In 2024, we welcomed new collaborations with community organizations such as Hillel at Kent State, Sister Circle Kent State, MEN of Kent State, Davey Elementary Student Council, and Daisy Pops.

While we are always excited to expand our reach, our focus is on ensuring the school districts we currently serve are being maintained.


At BCFF, **growth is guided by purpose**, not by numbers alone.

## **The Ben Curtis Golf Classic**

This summer marked the 10th anniversary of the Ben Curtis Golf Classic, our flagship fundraiser, and we were proud to return to Barrington Golf Club, where our very first outing was held.

We are grateful to our Title Sponsor, Kaulig Giving, whose continued support since 2020 has helped this event thrive, and to our Champion Sponsors—Triad, Unity Health Network, and Young & Associates—whose elevated commitment creates deeper impact for the children and families we serve.

Thanks to the generosity of all who participated, the 2024 Golf Classic raised more than \$130,000, supporting Birdie Bags, A Very Merry Dinner, and programs that bring hope to children across our communities.


